Stebbing Primary School Home School Agreement



The home school agreement sets out the expectations of the school, parents and pupils.

The School will:

- Provide a safe, happy and stimulating environment.
- Support and encourage each child to develop a positive attitude to learning and do their best at all times.
- Aim for each child to achieve their full potential and be an independent and self-motivated learner.
- Provide a broad, balanced and creative curriculum.
- Inform parents of their child's progress through regular meetings with the class teacher.
- Provide a written report once a year.
- Alert parents to any difficulties or concerns the school has regarding a child's behaviour or learning.
- Encourage every child to become increasingly more responsible.

The parent/carers will:

- Ensure that their child attends school everyday and arrives on time ready to learn.
- Ensure their child wears the correct uniform.
- Not book holidays during school term time other than in exceptional circumstances.
- Attend family consultation meetings to discuss their child's progress.
- Support their child with homework and other opportunities for school learning.
- Encourage their child to have high standards of behaviour at all times and support the school in following the school Behaviour Policy.
- Support their child by attending at least one school-based workshop per year.
- Take an active and positive interest in their child's education.
- Support the AFSS and offer their services at at least one event per year.
- Encourage their child to be more responsible and achieve their STEPs challenge.

The pupil will:

- Always try their best when doing class work or un-homework tasks.
- Keep to their class school rules.
- Take care of the equipment, buildings and surroundings.
- Show respect for other pupils, staff and visitors in school.
- Try their best to become more independent and responsible as they get older.

To keep us all safe online we will ensure:

- Video-conferencing programs should not be used on a one to one basis between school staff and pupils – remote learning on a one to one basis is not appropriate;
- The platform should allow the school to restrict the audience, for example by asking them to create a login and password;
- Other people should not be able to reproduce and distribute the stream;
- Consent for pupils to participate in the stream should be obtained;
- There should be a code of conduct for staff and pupils using online platforms, for example those with message boards;
- During online activity staff and pupils should be in a neutral area, (ie, not in a bedroom or bathroom);
- Pupils and staff should use school-allocated email addresses, not personal ones, or use usernames and passwords which must not be shared with others;
- School should remind pupils of who they can contact at school for help or support;
- Pupils' personal information such as their location, date of birth or phone number should be kept private.
