ROBINS



The Wrens thoroughly enjoyed their visit from The Way Forward project. We heard all about the smashed windows and interesting features they have found in the Church refurbishment project. The Wrens were tasked to create stained glass windows of their own by decorating glass jars and lids. But the highlight was certainly making the stained class cookies.

Our Explorers have been learning all about Dinosaurs and enjoyed finding the dinosaurs up to mischief every time they came into the classroom. We have seen a strong interest in writing about our dinosaurs and love that the Wrens are starting to blend and write their own words.

Over the past few weeks the Wrens have been deepening their understanding of number bonds of ten. We hope you enjoy dice and dominoes games at home over the easter break as the Wrens have discovered turn taking games that encourage number knowledge.

We are very excited about our next topic: Come Outside and want to kindly request any seeds to plant or donations of artificial flowers for our role play flower shop.



What a fantastic final 2 weeks we've had in Kingfishers. The sun has been shining, Kingfishers have worked so hard and achieved so much!

In English Kingfishers completed their animal fact files and wrote imaginative and detailed Spring poems. I've really noticed huge progress within their writing. Their presentation is neat and consistent with many children joining their writing. Furthermore, their confidence to write more independently and incorporate their own ideas has been wonderful to witness and their work is so unique.

In Maths we have completed exploring length and measure and applied this knowledge to other areas of learning.

In Art we looked at Andy warhol's 'Pop art' technique and Kingfishers used bold, contrasting colours to create repeating prints.

I just want to say I have had the most wonderful time teaching your children this year. They have been amazing and have come such a long way! Miss Willingham is extremely lucky to be teaching Kingfishers class over the Summer term. Well done, Robins for completing another fantastic half term in year 1. You have all worked your socks off and we are all very proud of the progress you have all made. We cannot believe we are about to head into Summer Term! Robins had an exciting week this week as Dino Man came to visit to teach the children about dinosaurs and Mary Anning. Here is what the children learned and enjoyed in their own words...

"I really liked the really big photo of the dino head." "I really loved the T-Rex because it was so big and I didn't realise it would even be that big." "We learnt about the dinosaurs becoming extinct." "I liked it when I got to sit on the Triceratops. It was quite fun."

Over the past couple of weeks the children have completed a DT moving book project. They have all produced wonderful Mary Anning biographies and illustrated their books beautifully.

WOODPECKERS

Short but very sweet; our 'Light' Science topic has been really hands on and very fun. We have enjoyed learning from first hand experiences and now know lots of facts not only about light but how our eves work too.

This term Woodpeckers have made great progress with their writing, especially their understanding of formal and informal letters. They have actively been working on their writing targets; trying to join their letters, include varied conjunctions and varied punctuation correctly. We are addressing (in a few cases) the rule that plurals do NOT have an apostrophe (ie: pens, dresses) - a very common misconception. We are using apostrophes only to show possession, ie: Ben's coat, James' coat, or for a contraction (do not = don't), signalling that omitted letter.

Magical Maths has shown during Assessments to really improve the children's maths confidence, fluency and recall. This will continue next term and we will re-sit the very first Maths Assessment we did in Year 3 - Place Value. I expect now that this will show how much more understanding the class now have of 3 digit numbers.





The last two weeks have flown by and I cannot believe we are already $\frac{2}{3}$ of the way through the year. One of the highlights of the last two weeks was our river trip. Isabelle was a fabulous tour guide and led us to our wonderful spot where the children were able to observe erosion and deposition. Since then, they have also resratched the different stages of a river and created some lovely double page spreads about what they found out. We have also finished our explanation text unit, where the children have been able to really showcase what they have learnt in their explanation of the water cycle. In maths, we have continued with fractions and have faced many different challenges with adding and subtracting fractions as well as converting mixed numbers to improper fractions! Our Kiwick Cricket.

Over the last couple of weeks, the children have really worked hard on their unhomeworks and I am pleased to say that the majority of the class were able to enjoy some extra breaktime today in the sunshine to celebrate this.

I hope that you all have a restful and wonderful Easter Holidays, hopefully in lots more sunshine and I look forward to our final term in Kestrels!



I can't actually believe how much we have been able to fit into the short term and that is all down to the hard work of each and every child in Owls class. As you will know, the children have sat their final mock papers over the past two weeks and have all demonstrated fantastic progress as each test has gone by and we have a fantastic benchmark of the areas that we need to cover when we return after the Easter break.

Our final piece of writing before we broke up turned out to be one of the most thoughtful and detailed pieces of work that the class have produced as they applied their knowledge and research about animals in captivity to construct a balanced discussion text portraying both sides of the argument whilst maintain a middle position presenting their own personal viewpoint when appropriate.

And just like that, Spring term has come to a close and we look forward to our final term together at Stebbing Primary School which is jam packed with SATs, pizza projects, Crucial Crew, Bikeability, sports day, music concerts, drama performances, sporting fixtures and finally, Leavers'. And just like that another term in Year 5 has come to a clos One more to go! It has been so wonderful o see how all of the children have grown over the past 2 terms and all of the incredible progress that they have made. They should all be so incredibly proud of themselves and really celebrate all of their successes! This week, we have concluded lots of an units of work and are excited about what there is to come! have really enjoyed listening to all of the children's recent he writes over the past few days, they have worked so incredib hard on these and have loved created their own litt iMovies!
