### ROBINS



Thank you for a lovely afternoon to celebrate the King's Coronation. We hope the weather improves this weekend and that you get to enjoy lots of time together.

In phonics we are continuing to review phase 2 and phase 3 sounds. We have become very confident with reading and are now putting more of a focus onto sentence writing to build our confidence. Over the next couple of weeks we will also be sending home some activities to support with letter formation which will make writing even easier.

In maths we have become confident with numbers to 20 and representing them using many concrete and pictorial resources. This is going to really support us in year 1. For the rest of the term we will be moving onto addition and subtraction.

We have really enjoyed learning about the life cycle of a butterfly. Wrens have shared their knowledge with Miss Honeybee in Forest School too. We are looking forward to planting bean seeds next week as we continue out Come Outside topic.

Thank you so much for joining us today for our indoor Coronation 'picnic' gathering. The children absolutely loved making their cucumber sandwiches. I managed to speak to some of you this afternoon but for those of you I missed. I have to share an unexpected phenomenon. Before the sandwich making began I explained to the children their task and we discovered too that Victorians enjoyed cucumber sandwiches, I explained that ours would be 'posh' like at an Afternoon Tea for Ladies & Gentlemen... with no crusts! The room roared with excitement. Then, to our absolute surprise, after making their sandwiches, what was the first guestion?... "Can we eat our crusts?" Why is it that when no longer attached crusts all of a sudden become appealing? Bless them. We've been thrilled to see how many children enjoy eating cucumber too - this looks promising for our upcoming salad topic in DT. To prepare for the Coronation we all learned about London this week during our Group Reading sessions, and next week the focus will be Queen Victoria. Robins are looking forward to their visit to Audley End House and have learned and remember many facts already, about the Victorians. We've learned about the Victorian seaside, and today; a bit about Victorian schools and toys (The Robins were pleased to be experiencing 2023 schooling rather than the Victorian Style!) and we also found out about the heroine Grace Darling today. We are enjoying our Beatrix Potter stories too.





# WOODPECKERS



What a busy 2 weeks we've had in Kingfishers.

We have been juggling our Maths learning, focusing on time, fractions and shapes, and Kingfishers have worked incredibly hard and have embraced and enjoyed this approach so far this term.

In English we have been focusing on time conjunctions and persuasive language and Kingfishers have been planning their persuasive letter to the Lion.

In Science we have been learning about plants and so far we have focused on what they need to survive and the sequence of growth. Kingfishers planted their own seeds this week and over the half term we will watch them grow and develop as part of an ongoing observation.

In History we have been learning about explorers and what made them significant.

We learnt about Amy Johnson, nicknamed "Queen of the air" who was a famous female British pilot who broke many records whilst travelling around the world. We also learnt about Leif Erikson, a Viking explorer who is thought to be the first European to discover and build a settlement in North America. Kingfishers have really enjoyed learning about these people's achievements and the impact they had on the world.

What a wonderful two weeks we have had in Woodpeckers class. The children have been working incredibly hard on their coronation bunting and drawings in preparation for the Coronation picnic today - which we would like to thank you all for attending. In English, the children have continued on their journey of letter writing. They have been discussing what makes a letter informal or formal and how to format a letter appropriately.

In Maths, the children have been focusing on comparing non unit to unit fractions, using concrete manipulatives alongside to aid their learning. They have also been investigating and exploring the whole in relation to fractions. They have been using part-whole models to develop their understanding.

The children have been completely engrossed in our history topic for this half term. They have thoroughly enjoyed identifying reasons and results of people's actions., where the children discussed who they thought started World War II and why it happened. After investigating this further, the children then created a

Kestrels have had a very busy two weeks. The children have really enjoyed swimming and this week and a brilliant session working hard on their breathing under water. Kestrels has been learning all about Ancient Egypt and enjoyed the adventures of Tadeo Jones in their English lessons. Looking at personification and figurative language, the children have enhanced their writing by describing the setting and ordering events chronologically. The children are working towards writing a diary entry imagining they are Tadeo Jones. Today in groups we acted out the story in chronological order using freeze frames. In Maths the children have been learning about decimals. We have explored whole numbers and tenths using place value grids and number lines. We have been dividing one and two digit numbers by ten. In History we have started to explore the meaning of Hieroglyphics and the significance of the Rosetta Stone. Our RE lessons on Christianity has been very apt with the Coronation being celebrated this weekend. We have looked at the different denominations within Christianity and the symbols used in places of worship. The children have enjoyed making coronation bunting, drawing the Kings crown and making flags. Thank you so much for joining us for our picnic day, we have had such a brilliant day celebrating.

The weeks are really starting to fly by now, it is genuinely terrifying how fast it is going! We have been making some real progress in Ospreys and it has been so lovely to see the children taking such a pride in their work and their attitudes to learning are really improving. We finally got our first swimming lesson this week which everyone loved. The sun even started to come out a little bit which was nice! In science, we have been investigating thermal insulators and conductors which lead us nicely onto taking this thinking further by moving onto electrical insulators and conductors this week. We had the challenge of working out what was the most effective electrical conductor which would ensure bulbs would burn the brightest in a football stadium. The children act to investigate this by creating their own simple circuits and testing a range of materials.

Thank you so much for coming out to celebrate with us today- we really enjoyed making the cheese scones to share with you all and spending time with you. Have a lovely bank holiday weekend!
