ROBINS



Our Wrens Explorers have been on a trip to the continent of Africa. Together we have shared experiences of travelling to a different country by Aeroplane or Ferry. We have really enjoyed our Topic Book: Handa's Surprise. Our simple sentence writing was all about the cheeky animals and the fruit they snatched. In Forest School we have noticed a lot of changes in our surroundings. We have been talking a lot about the seasons and how plants grow. The Wrens have been climbing the Grandmother tree, noticing buds forming on her branches. It is such a wonderful space for them to showcase their understanding of the world and the changes within it. Our PSHE lessons has been all about listening carefully and respecting the choices of our friends. Playing Simon Says and Listening Games has been a fun way to put what we have learnt into practice. In Maths we have been exploring Length and Height. We have compared our height to the animals we have been reading about. Wrens have enjoyed many tasty treats with a lovely fruit tasting experience with Miss Summers and pancakes with Ms Osborne. Using our Phonics we were able to describe and write about taste, instructions and recipes.

Robins have worked exceptionally hard over the past couple of weeks to produce the most amazing 'Ten Little...' stories. We have been thinking about digging deeper when writing sentence by adding more detail to our sentences. Some children have even commented on when they think an author has dug deeper when reading their story book. We are in the process of create 3 class books. The Robins worked their hardest to use their best presentation when writing in a pen. It was VERY exciting.

In maths we have been learning about number bonds to 20. We have explored how our number bonds to 10 can help us and had the challenge of finding out how many number bonds to 20 there are. It is very important for the children to become fluent with these number facts as they will help them when learning other skills in maths.

World Book Day was great fun and we loved reading outside in the sunshine at the end of the school day. It was exciting to see the children's costumes and their cosy pyjamas. Keep reading at home and writing in your child's diary to help them become a reading star at the end of each week. Reading little and often supports fluency. Have a great weekend!

In Maths we have started our money topic. We discussed value and symbols.

We have focused on ordering and making the same amount in different ways.

In English we have been carrying out purposeful research in order to create our animal fact files. We agreed that in order to know if it is purposeful we must read it and understand it, before writing it. We have highlighted and discussed any new or unusual words along the way, whilst ensuring we only look for information linked to our subtitles

Science links beautifully to our English topic this half term, where we are exploring 'Animals including humans'. We have focused on animal groups and identifying their shared features.

Kingfishers had fun going around their scootering assault course. The sun was shining and warm for us!
Kingfishers really enjoyed their Great Fire of London day.
The children had the opportunity to reenact the event and turn themselves into important people from 1666.

We have welcome a new Kestrel over the last two weeks, Eva, who has fitted into our class beautifully. It's like she has always been with us! We have also been really bust starting lots of new units of work. We have started by learning a poem called 'The Sound Collector' where we have explored rhyme and rhythm. This week, we have taken what we have learnt and created our own poem about sounds within a school. We then performed them using various musical instruments. In maths, we have been learning all about length and perimeter. The children have loved measuring using trundle wheels as well as exploring how to measure the outside of different shapes. In Science, we have started our unit on states of matter. The children have explored the ways in which particles move in these different states by acting them out and created an experiment to prove that materials can change state.

Our new Geography topic is river! So far we have started to learn about trivers through our guided reading sessions as well as creating our own water cycle wheels. The children have learnt the terms evaporation, precipitation and condensation.

Our highlight of the last two weeks though has been World Book Day. I was lovely to see so many of you dressed up either through an inspired book character or to enjoy bedtime stories. We also loved exploring the book 'The Bear and the Piano'.

We have welcomed two new Ospreys this week: Oliver and Billy. V hope they have enjoyed their first few days at Stebbing.

The children have enjoyed learning about Quidditch and the skills explain it clearly, which led to them producing some detailed ar sophisticated explanation texts in their hot write. We have ju finished our Maths unit on percentages and I was very impress with how quickly the children grasped this new concept. We a looking forward to a new topic of perimeter and area next week.

In Geography, it has been great to apply our learning abo co-ordinates and locating places on the globe to finding loc addresses and directions.

In Art, we have looked at the work of artist Georgia O'Keefe and ha she uses blending to create the smooth texture of her work. We as looking forward to practising the technique and recreating some O'Keefe's work.

The highlight for many (including me!) this week has been today when we have celebrated World Book Day. It is always a pleas to see so many children inspired by and excited by books. I ho you and your child will enjoy sharing a story tonight. Why not lo up The Bear and The Piano on YouTube and let your Osprey sho what activities we have done today.
