WRENS



ROBINS



In PE Wrens have been learning to move to music like animals across the Savannah. We counted to the music: 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8 and moved eloquently. Wrens did small performances in two groups and gave each other a score out of 10. We have been so surprised at how independent and quickly we get changed now and celebrated together on our achievements. Our Role Play area has turned into a Post Office and we have been very busy. The Postman delivered mail to the School and we received messages from Pets and Grandparents! Wrens have really enjoyed experiencing how the Royal Mail Service works and staff have been receiving various parcels to sign for during each day. We are so proud of our Wrens' journey to the big playground. After welcoming our Owl buddies to play with us in our outdoor area we gradually introduced other children to join us in our playground. This has really helped Wrens find familiar faces on the playground and enable us to foster that sense of belonging and kindness as a School community. The Wrens have supported each other by introducing older siblings and encouraging each other to join in with group games. What an incredible achievement Wrens! We are so proud to be part of your journey. In Maths we have been reading The Button Box and explored different patterns. We have been Mastering the skill to subitise! (Seeing and saying an amount) Our story sequencing skills and teamwork were tested by retelling Goldilocks and the Three Bears. We loved hearing the Wrens retelling The Three Billy Goats Gruff in the outdoor area, pretending the climbing frame is the Troll's bridge. We are excited to announce that we have all been given a part in our Christmas performance. Rehearsals have begun and we already know a few words to the songs we plan to sing.

It truly has been lovely to be back from our Autumn break. We completed our 'Gunpowder Plot' History topic just in time for November 5th. We consolidated our learning by watching the 2021 'Guy Forks' episode of Worzel Gummidge, and enjoyed a variety of painting techniques to create some stunning firework pictures which were embellished with some glue & glitter. We have just finished reading a children's chapter book about the plot as well, and now before home time we are reading Rudyard Kipling's 'Just So Stories'.

As the winter festivities draw closer we have begun to read a winter or Christmas themed story before lunch each day, as a bit of extra fun and preparation as well as the occasional RE learning. Each day this week we have been monitoring the Rain Gauge in our class flower bed; gathering and recording results for Science and linking well with our maths too. We learned about the water surface (known as 'meniscus') and have been careful to measure the water from the bottom of its meniscus to get an accurate reading. From the weekend, on Monday morning (7th) our Rain Gauge had caught 33mm of rain!

KINGFISHERS



We have had a brilliantly busy 2 weeks in Kingfishers and they have settled back into school life and routines really well after the half term. We have been exploring many different concepts with a focus on addition and subtraction involving bonds to 20, 'chocolate' bar models, number lines, related facts and fact families. In English we are writing our own stories. We have been exploring a variety of settings and created our characters, alongside learning about different perspectives and predicting what might happen next based on what they already know.

In Science we discussed seasons and had an interactive, hands on lessons discussing what changes occur in Autumn. We then learnt about an influential person of Science - Charles Darwin. We explored his theory that species evolve in order to survive and the 'Survival of the fittest' concept. In Geography we have been learning about the UK and it's capital cities and Kingfishers have certainly enjoyed using Atlases in order to underpin their learning and understanding.



What an incredible couple of weeks we have had in Woodpeckers class. In our English lessons, we have been exploring and becoming familiar with Julia Donaldson texts.

First, we read through a range of her books as a class. Then, in groups, we discussed what we noticed about her stories. We were able to identify many features, including rhyme, strong characters, all of the stories were fiction and that there was a moral to each. Later in the week, we worked together to understand how to perform rhyme. The children were split into groups and provided with a Julia Donaldson text, they were then to perform using expression. In preparation for remembrance day, we worked hard to produce our own poppy inspired stained glass window. We began with a simple black frame and carefully added strips of coloured tissue paper. We finalised our own windows by cutting out a poppy silhouette and sticking it to the front of our wonderful creations. In maths, we have been continuing with our addition and subtraction unit. We have been exploring a range of strategies to add 1-digit numbers to a 2-digit number crossing 10. We used place value charts and number lines to aid our learning and built on this by then adding 1-digit numbers to 3 digit numbers.







Kestrels have started our second Autumn term with enthusiasm and excitement. We have loved continuing to learn about persuasive speeches and this week have finished their own persuasive battle speech to encourage their tribe to battle against an evil creature. In maths, we have continued with addition and subtraction using column methods. The children's deep understanding of this has been reflected in such wonderful practical work and they have really enjoyed manipulating numbers. Rehearsals for our Christmas play are well underway so be prepared for a lot of FUNKY camel lyrics being practised at home as this seems to be the most popular song at the moment!

In Science, we have started to learn about sound and have enjoyed experimenting with vibrations of sound in different forms. During enrichment, Kestrels are now taking part in PE and Drama on a Wednesday afternoon. The buzz of excitement when they see these subjects on a Wednesday morning is wonderful to see. We have also really enjoyed playing games with each other on our

Friday fun time, the yes and no game being a huge hit in the class with lots of giggles constantly surrounding the classroom!

Ospreys have enjoyed another two weeks of fast paced action in the classroom. They are really developing, each and every day and it is so wonderful to see the progress that they are making. In maths, they have just completed their first multiplication and division block which focused on square, cube and prime numbers as well as factors and multiples. Next week, we will be moving onto the first fractions block of the year. We can't reiterate enough how important times table knowledge is going to be support the children's work in fractions, so any extra practise you can do at home would be much appreciated! In Science, we have started to explore the wonderful world of space. It is one of my favourite topics to teach and the children have created some really excellent pieces of work so far. They have been sent home a moon diary today to help them identify and recognise the different phases of the moon. I will look forward to seeing those completed in a months time! Finally, with Mrs Smith, Ospreys have been learning all about 'Extreme Earth' and I know they will be excited to know that there will be some volcano construction in the very near future!
