Last year, when I carried out a survey of children's thoughts about reading, I was really shocked to see that over 50% of Year 1 children said they didn't enjoy reading. I am now a Year 2 teacher and they nearly all absolutely LOVE reading. What's changed since last year? The definition of reading. It's really important for children to see that reading is not just about decoding words (which <u>is</u> HARD when you're first learning to do it), it's about sharing stories, letting language wash over us, discussing plots and characters and locations, and using books as a magic way to travel to far-away lands and be inspired by incredible characters and events. Research shows us that children who enjoy reading are more successful and happier in life. You can help foster your child's love of reading: read TO your child (even if they can read themselves), let them see you reading, join the library, listen to audiobooks, talk about books, act them out and imagine what might happen next... As I look ahead to 2026 (the Year of Reading), I am excited about the opportunities coming up. Bonnie's family have kindly donated a book exchange, we will be having an author visit in the New Year and many other treats. Happy reading!
