Kingfishers have had the most amazing final 2 weeks of the Autumn term. They have all worked so incredibly hard during their rehearsals and I'm sure you would all agree that they were absolutely amazing during their performances! Kingfishers have continued to work hard within all aspects of their learning. In Maths we have explored the 4 operations, various approaches to support their adding and subtracting with exchange, exploring number cards to make various answers over 100 and they have created their own Maths stories. These are just some examples of their learning and achievements across this half term. Kingfishers also completed their hot writes, whereby they created their own characters and wrote a story based on the dangers and harm that leaving rubbish can cause to other living things. Many children have written 2 - 3 pages and have included lots of adjectives, adverbs, paragraphs and various punctuation. Furthermore, their handwriting has been so clear and neat. It's certainly the most beautiful handwriting I've seen so far this year and I have thoroughly enjoyed reading their wonderful stories!

The girl has made it to the second limb of the grandmother tree.

The grandmother tree is our beautiful Oak climbing tree. Over the years her branches have lowered, smoothed off and adapted to the hundreds of children who have scaled her limbs. Each of the lower branches have grown in a formation of different levels and shapes, almost like steps. Each step requires planning and gross motor skills to ascend. Our tree has hosted forts, dens and potion workshops and supported multiple layers of imagination.. It has provided us with acorns and leaves for crafts, dry sticks for whittling and wood for the fire. It is also home for over 300 different species of minibeasts, mammals and birdlife. 'How do you fee!?' asked Miss Honeybee 'I feel big' said the beaming girl .The tree isn't so big but for this little one it's a

This little girl has been trying to reach the second limb unaided for weeks on end, reflecting on why a move she took didn't work so well. She has watched her peers and the routes they take, noting the best places to hold on and using things about her to help her succeed.

For this little one, she has built resilience, overcame a fear of heights, made a plan, asked for advice, self reflected, persevered and undertook self care.

Forest School is full of stories like this, it's not just playing in the mud. The social interaction, sharing ideas, resolving disputes, creativity and taking appropriate supported risks help build our children up to be confident learners. They notice the changes outside, they feel and see them, they wonder and care about the space they play in.

Forest School is a special place, all year round healthy outdoor child led learning developing fine and gross motor skills and so much more.

Learning skills for life such as fire lighting, cooking, self care, communication with others, relating to seasonal changes, nature connection and acceptance.
