GUEST SPOT- MRS BUCKNELL- DRAMA

The time has come again where I foolishly decide it would be amazing to put on a Summer production with the students to showcase their hard work. Needless to say I forget each year how little time we have; how high their expectations are and how much works goes into it! It is always worth it, and I am incredibly proud of each and every student I have the privilege to work with and learn from.

In previous years we have done 'Extracts from plays', a mashed-up version of 'Alice in Wonderland' and last year 'Square Eyes' which was a series of extracts and improvisations based around the television. Whilst you may wonder what an odd mix of works, we bring to you each year I feel very passionately that Drama should be inclusive and about allowing each and every student time to shine; this means that I tend to avoid pre-scripted works. Life would be much easier if we did choose a pre-made script but that then means a handful of students get the really exciting parts and the rest of the student become background characters. This has its place and is a very worthwhile and valid experience, developing resilience and teamwork. However, for some students (especially those who may struggle with an audition/reading process) this can be really daunting.

In Drama Club everyone is the star of the show. We are again this year combining the two groups and the choir to create a wonderful performance based on the concept of students being 'Snowed in' at school. What happens when they can not escape, there is little to do, and the teachers have all mysteriously vanished?! I am not entirely sure of the answer to these questions myself at this stage, as the work will be based on improvised scenes, scripted extracts and songs selected by the students. It is currently a work in progress and whilst it is not the easiest way to work it means the students have ownership of the piece, they steer the direction of the work, they apply the drama techniques they have learnt, and most importantly have

fun in the process. I am privileged to have watched the Drama Club and Choir grow each year we have worked together, and I will be extremely sad but proud to see the huge year 6 cohort leave. They joined me in year 3. They are indeed a very talented bunch who I hope will continue to act, sing, perform, entertain and create. Even if the students do not continue with their Drama/Choir journey I hope they have wonderfu memories and have learnt at the very least to work with anyone, enjoy being creative and know it's ok to be daft!
