A small number of children had some apprehensions and a bit of anxiety, however all of them overcame this with support, not only from us but from you too - so thank you parents for working with us and helping the children learn their lines and get into character. KINGFISHERS

What a wonderful end to our first term!

The Children have been amazing and they have all worked so hard and persevered through our busy Christmas schedule. In Maths we have been exploring exchange, number lines and taking away ten from any given number. We have been using the CPA approach and our deep dive focus has been creating Maths stories from calculations.

In English we wrote a letter to Santa with a focus on Key features and structure, asking questions and using commas and conjunctions effectively. Kingfishers really enjoyed this unit during the build up to Christmas and I have thoroughly enjoyed reading their detailed and thoughtful letters. In Science we explored the meaning of 'adaptation', linking this to our previous learning on Albert Einstein. The Children practised their computing skills and researched various animals and how they have adapted to their environment in order to survive.

In the build up to Christmas the children have been extremely busy with their crafts and Christmas Play practise, as well as carrying on with their brilliant learning.

I am beyond proud of Kingfishers and their many achievements this half term. It has been lovely watching them flourish within their singing and acting skills, their ability to learn lines and speak clearly and confidently, and to see their imaginative and creative side so much over the past few

WOODPECKERS

The children have been incredibly productive over the past two weeks. In English, they have been working towards completing their own set of instructions, based on how reindeer fly. They came up with some wonderfully creative ideas and thoroughly enjoyed this Christmas unit.

In maths, they children have continued to work on addition and subtraction. They have been working on subtracting two numbers (across a 100), where they have been using base 10 and place value counters to represent calculations alongside the written method. At each step of the subtraction, the children were asking whether they needed to make an exchange.

In RE, the children have been focusing on understanding the importance of miracle. This week, they looked into Jesus' first miracle "The wedding". They read through the story from the children's bible. They focused on key vocabulary and how Jesus turned water into wine, resulting in them each creating their own story map.

In the build up to Christmas, the children have been extremely busy, preparing many fabulous crafts in preparation for the upcoming Christmas craft fair. We were so impressed with every single member of Woodpeckers, their amazing hard work and determination throughout the Christmas performance and rehearsals was absolutely fantastic.
