We have enjoyed reading the story 'Jasper's Beanstalk' last week which led us to planting our own seeds. We are excited to look after them and watch them grow. We wrote a set of instructions before planting so we understood what we needed to do.

In maths we have moved onto addition and subtraction. We have been creating our own first, then, now stories to support us with understanding the concepts. Take a look on Class Dojo to see some photos. Subtraction SMASH has definitely been our favourite!

We have updated our self-portrait display this week. Mrs Thorp worked with us to model how to draw a self portrait, reminding us to think about the size and shape of different features on our face.

This week we have read Jack and the Beanstalk. We were very excited to find a beanstalk in our classroom on Tuesday morning. We have been using our imagination to think about what land we would like to find at the top of the beanstalk. We enjoyed building, drawing and writing our ideas. We have worked very hard to remember capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. We are also making sure we form our letters carefully.

It has been a great delight to have the weather on our side; being more spring/summer like at last. We have been able to use our outdoor area for some independent phonics and maths learning, making the most of our benches which contain numicon resources and missing number sentences, and sitting on the blanket to do some word building with the cubes, magnetic or wooden letters. Robins have enjoyed watching our salad crops grow too and seeing the flowers bloom in our planters. This has tied in nicely with not just Science but also our Guided reading texts this week. We have been getting stronger with our fluency of number - finding number families and seeing how many 'part part whole' calculations we can come up with that include addition or subtraction. Fractions is what we are working on now - we've focused particularly on halves this week, using concrete and pictorial representations and next week we will look at guarters. We are also learning a Percy Parker 5 times table song.

Our spectacular, sensational sentences this week have been based on the wonderful trip we had to Audley End House last week. We are really trying hard to write neatly using the correct letter sizes and formation, and the correct case, ensuring that our non-negotiables (capital letters, finger spaces and full stops) are included, as well as the spellings that we are now aware of and interesting vocabulary.

WOODPECKERS

In Maths we have continued to focus on time, length and measure and Money and we have done various hands-on activities in order to explore these areas in a fun and creative way.

Kingfishers completed their persuasive letter and produced lovely hotwrites, with a focus on time adverbs, persuasive language and structure, as well as being more mindful of their presentation and non-negotiables.

In Science we are continuing to learn about plants and this week we explored the different parts of a plant and their functions. Kingfishers had their own flowers to investigate, and now these flowers have been added to our lovely, newly revamped, outdoor area, helping the outdoor space to look more inviting.

Since this warmer, dryer weather has arrived, Kingfishers have enjoyed listening to their class story outside, and as the weather improves we hope to utilise that area more and more. Kingfishers have blown me away with their hard work and dedication during our SATs practices this week.

They have followed the instructions and 'rules' incredibly well and have shown perseverance and a positive, open mind-set. Kingfishers know that all we expect is for them to try their best, and they have certainly delivered.

The Kingfishers adults are so proud of you all. Amazing work Kingfishers!

We have been working on a new unit within our English lessons throughout the last two weeks, focusing on stories in an unfamiliar setting. We have been reading The Lion and the Unicorn, we began with discussing what they felt the book may be about (based on observations of the front cover). We then proceeded to answer a range of questions in relation to our VIPERS skills for reading.

In maths, we have completed our first block of our fractions unit. We have been building on our understanding of unit and non-unit fractions and the exploration of how fractions can be represented on a number line. This involved identifying how many equal parts a number line had been split into. In History, we have been discussing the impact of propaganda posters during World War II. The children were supplied with a range of different examples, to which they then had to annotate based on why it would have persuaded them. For their task, they were to create their own propaganda poster to persuade Stebbing to join a certain club.

In Science, we have continued building on our knowledge of the three main types of rock. We carried out an investigation into the common properties of rocks, including the density, durability, whether they are permeable or impermeable and also if they are hard or soft. What an exciting sports week for Kestrels. We are incredibly proud of how well they have represented Stebbing at the recent Rapid Fire Cricket tournament. We would also like to wish our Tag Rugby Squad a huge congratulations for being awarded with gold medals after a nail biting match against Little Hallingbury.

Our Maths lessons with Mrs Clark was all about understanding hundredths as decimals. This tied in beautifully with the lessons about comparing money with Mrs Earle enabling us to understanding the place value of pennies.

In Science we had a sweet experiment, predicting what type of chocolate will melt first. Our experiments were a clear example of fair testing as different scenarios presented us with different results. This raised more probabilities to investigate.

Our History lesson was perfectly timed with our English writing sequence. We found out all about Howard Carter and the discovery of Tutankamun's tomb. This inspired us to use the skill of 'show don't tell' in our paragraphs in preparation for our Hot Writes.

RE was a very good reflection lesson on milestones achieved and highlights to look forward to in the next half term. You all deserve a lovely restful weekend.

In the last couple of weeks Ospreys have been ploughing through lots of assessments linked to their current learning. Mrs Smith and I have been extremely impressed with the way in which the children have applied themselves and for having some growth mindsets. We even joined the Year 6's in SATs week by competing an old reading SATs paper and I have to say I was really impressed by their very first attempt at this. They were all really excited to try it and I think they impressed themselves! I am looking forward to working through it with them over the next week to ensure they all understood the questions fully.

I also have to share with you how impressed we have been with the way in which many of the members of our class have been applying themselves in our wider school community. They have been offering to help Sam in the lunch hall when we have been short staffed; they have been helping to serve and clear tables. They have set such a good example that Sm even brought them some strawberry milkshake during Friday funtime last week! I am really proud of how they are setting such a good example. Well done Ospreys!
