We hope you all had a wonderful half term. It has been great to see the children return to school with big smiles on their faces and with excitement.

It have been a great week learning about pancake day. We have completed lots of pancake themed activities which we will continue into next week too. Wrens have blown me away with their confidence with retelling our new story The Runaway Pancake. They have created story maps in groups and independently. They have also challenged themselves to write words on their story maps too.

In Maths we have been learning about length and height. We have compared the length of different objects in class. We have also used our footprints to find objects that are longer/ shorter than it. Today we learnt to measure using bricks which was really fun.

We have started our new topic - Explorers. We have enjoyed exploring our new Travel Agents role play area and learning about the 7 continents. We are going to dive deeper into Africa over the next few weeks, including going on a Stebbing Safari. Keep your eyes peeled for some Show and Tell Unhomework over the next week.

This week Robins have chosen what news to share with you themselves...

"We've been painting with hot colours and we've been learning lots of new sounds" - Jasmina.

"We've been learning a lot of new sounds. We've been learning... a list." - Axel

"I've done Dance Club. We do a couple of songs a day and people go on the stage to do it. We did performances in PE, like Gymnastics. Lists have commas and they can be in a straight line. It only needs a new line if you run out of space on your line" - Nicole.

"Instructions have to have numbers at the start. They have to have 'First, After, or Then, Next or Last'. They are called Time Conjunctions" - Harvey.

"We've been learning about numbers; odd and even. We did pictures on our art leaflets. We used a black pen." - Jenna "We've been learning about coins and money paper, counting in tens." - Holly "...and we'll count in twos" - Savannah "I've enjoyed playing with my friends at lunchtime" - Alfie "In PE we did rolling. Pencil rolls and log rolls." - Monty "The people who were doing the walking and pencil roll done a finish off and the other people who did it after they were the judges. Then we swapped. It was brilliant" - Louie.P







We hope you all had a wonderful half term break. Kingfishers have had a lovely week and have settled back into school really well. We have continued our Animal Fact Files in English and our focus this week was researching, drafting and writing about our chosen animal's habitat.

In Maths we have started our multiplication topic, focusing on exploring and building with concrete, drawing equal groups and creating their own sentences for their peers to work out. Kingfishers have grasped this really well and they are all eager to continue to deepen their understanding of this topic. We have linked our Science topic to our English to provide further opportunities to deepen their knowledge and this week we have learnt about the various animal groups, focusing on shared similar features as well as exploring the broad diversities amongst the animal groups.

In grammar we have been exploring contractions through a variety of hands-on group and independent activities. Some Kingfishers have been further consolidating their understanding of sentence structure with a focus on the non-negotiables in order to reinforce their fundamental writing skills. This half terms PE topic is Dodgeball, which Kingfishers were very excited about. Today we practised our underarm and overarm throwing with a focus on strength and accuracy.

What a wonderfully bright and sunny half term we had. We hope you all had a well rested break. The children certainly appeared fresh and eager to learn upon their return this week.

We started the week focusing on the second part of our multiplication and division unit of maths. We began by discussing multiples of ten, making connections and noticing patterns, that multiples of ten end in a zero and using these facts to help them to solve other problems.

In english, we have been exploring the main features of a persuasive text. We worked in groups, read through a range of persuasive writing examples and highlighted these to allow us to create discussion. We had a wonderful lesson based on giving opinion. We were to debate and discuss the possibility of a four day school week but having to attend over seven hours and whether we would be 'for' or 'against' this alternative. The debate was fantastic and we were completely engrossed in the topic.

In geography, we started a new topic, where we have been focusing on what a settlement is and looking onto the different types of settlement. We spent some time investigating the differences between each and writing down a number of facts for each. In Science, we were building on our understanding that we need light in order to see things and that dark s the absence of light. We carried out a number of experiments that included feely bags filled with a range of different objects along with a dark tent. We were to make predictions and reason.





We hope you all had a wonderful half term break. Kestrels have adapted wonderfully to the change of Mrs Hammond leaving and their weekly timetable looking slightly different. We have been super impressed with how hard they are working. In Maths we have been finishing off our multiplication work with Mrs Clark. We explored related facts and multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100. We are finishing off this week by exploring different division methods. Next week we will begin fantastic fractions. With Mrs Earle the class are learning about shapes. So far they have recapped their shape knowledge in an exciting treasure hunt. In English we are coming to the end of our work linked to the story 'Journey'. We have explored how to make our sentences more detailed and interesting to read, created story boards and got our head around regular and irregular verbs. We then created our hot writes where we wrote our own story about a journey. Next week we begin working on explanation texts and our work will be based around Wallace and Gromit. We have now started our new topic of water cycles and in Science this half term we are learning about electricity. In PE we have started our netball focus. We enjoyed a brilliant lesson and showed perseverance in learning the new skills.

What a beautiful sunny half term we had! I really hope that you all managed to recharge and find some time to rest a little over the holiday. It was so lovely to be able to get out and about in the sunshine! We have started back this week with lots of plans looking ahead to the second half of the Spring term. We have started new areas of learning in all areas of the curriculum. In science, we have been focusing on Forces and we are all excited about taking part in some practical experiments for this unit as so may of our science unit are knowledge based! In English, we have dived into the world of Pandora and the children have been using literacy features to describe creatures in detail. Maths has seen us tackling the bus stop method which the children have flown with, we will be moving onto word problems involving multiplication and division next week.

I am really pleased to be able to report that we have some children that have finished all of their unhomeworks for the year which is incredible! All children that do this by the first week July will be involved in some sort of reward...more to come on this at a later date!

I cannot believe we have already passed the halfway point of the year! The past four days have seen the children come back to school with a fantastic appetite for learning and this has resulted in some fantastic work.

We have started to work on our new English unit focusing on Discussion texts and we have made use of the Blackfish documentary to help us understand the different viewpoints to keeping animals in captivity - specifically focusing on Orcas in this example. We have develop some wonderfully passionate viewpoints and look forward to debating these next week as we build up to writing our own discussion text.
