Through thoughtful discussion, accurate knowledge, and creative learning, pupils learn to be **READY** to understand others, **RESPECTFUL** of different beliefs, **SAFE** in expressing their views, and **KIND** in how they listen and respond.

We pride ourselves in delivering accurate and authentic learning:

- Using carefully chosen, authentic resources (videos, artefacts, **guest speakers**) that reflect how real people live out their beliefs
- We strive to include stories, festivals, and practices from both religious and nonreligious perspectives.
- Inviting speakers to deliver assemblies or classroom Q&A sessions

-Family involvement opportunities: you are invited to contribute or share experiences during special topic weeks.

We offer a Thematic and Reflective exploration:

- Using SATRE's "big questions" approach to structure enquiry and reflective dialogue. incorporate philosophy to help pupils explore ideas respectfully. Ensuring RE lessons include time for silent reflection, journaling, or creative expression to explore personal beliefs and values.
- At our whole-school celebration assembly we say our whole school reflection to bring us together as a diverse community.

Together we take part in engaging, inclusive experiences:

- Our teachers plan interactive RE lessons using drama, role play, storytelling, and art to bring beliefs and traditions to life.
- We arrange visits to local places of worship and virtual tours where physical visits aren't possible.
- Including whole-school events tied to significant celebrations across worldviews
