You can use the Local Offer to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • understand what to do if you're new to SEND • browse for local support such as support groups, fun activities or specialist healthcare • find out what to do in a complex situation, for example if you need to appeal a decision • get advice for young adults with SEND, such as housing and employment support

Your child does not need a diagnosis for you to come and get help at a roadshow. You may:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • be new to SEND and unsure what help is available • feel your child needs help or have questions about the support they already receive • want to find out what support there is for you as a parent or carer • not be sure what support you might need
